This has become an increasing concern on the part of community planners, residential developers, homebuilders, homeowners and other stakeholder groups as the prevalence of “zero lot line” communities have expanded throughout the U.S. in the recent past. “In essence, this code creates an environment where the risk of fire spreading from unit to unit such as we have seen in our area of Texas, as well as in many other metro areas throughout the U.S., will be dramatically reduced,” stated Albert Hernandez, Principle of No-Burn[®] of Bexar County.

The focus for this new code acceptance is the soffit assembly – the area of a home near the roof line that extends beyond the exterior wall. The approved assembly, pursuant to the requirements of the 2006 International Residential Code, and applicable to homes built 5 feet or closer to the property line, is as follows:

- Layer of 5/8th Type X Gypsum Board
- Layer of Fiber Cement siding (e.g. Hardiplank or other)
- No-Burn Plus Primer
- Weatherproofing Top Coat Sealer
