Project Background

Stan Hywet, now a well-known historical structure, was built in 1912 and was originally the residence of the Seiberling family. This 64,500 square foot historical structure is one of the finest examples of Tudor Revival architecture in America. An enormous amount of detail went into the building, and it is filled with treasures from around the globe.

The Gate Lodge was built in 1912 for the estate's superintendent. In 1935, the Gate Lodge became a meeting place holding discussions that resulted in identifying the principles that were to become the cornerstone of Alcoholics Anonymous. The legacy of the Gate Lodge extends beyond its historic significance, and is the never-ending source of inspiration for millions of people. In June 2004, the Gate Lodge was deemed the birthplace of Alcoholics Anonymous, and it is now a major destination for members of Alcoholics Anonymous from around the world.
